Solving the Bus Driver Crisis

Across Pennsylvania, school districts are having problems with getting enough school bus drivers to drive their full fleet of buses. This has led to some schools taking drastic action.

At West Shore and Cedar Cliff school districts in Cumberland County and Red Land School District in York County, students have had to alternate between in-person and virtual learning days because of the lack of available bus drivers. In our area, Souderton Area School District is hiring private transportation services to get kids to school at a much higher cost. And in Philadelphia, the School District of Philadelphia has offered families \$3,000 to transport their children to school.

These added costs are clearly untenable for school districts, and with what we know regarding learning loss during the pandemic, having students take online classes because school districts do not have enough bus drivers to transport them to school is unacceptable.

In response to this problem, I proposed legislation that I believe will help alleviate this crisis. House Bill 1306 would create a new tax credit, worth \$2,500, for new bus drivers that would last three years. This would give school districts a new tool to advertise open bus driver spots and help them fill these gaps across Pennsylvania. It is important we make sure our students get to school safely, on time and for in-person learning. We also need to ensure taxpayers dollars are spent as efficiently as possible, and this legislation will help to correct the workarounds happening now in various school districts across the Commonwealth.
