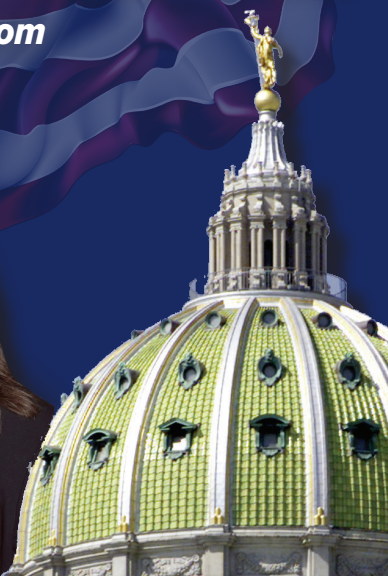

AN UPDATE ON THE BUDGET

Last month, Gov. Josh Shapiro held his annual budget address, where he pitched his proposed spending plan for the 2026-27 budget; I have multiple concerns:

- The proposed spending of \$53.26 billion is \$5.8 billion more than projected revenues.
- Gov. Shapiro has proposed using nearly 60% of the current Rainy Day Fund, or \$4.58 billion, to balance the budget.
- Once again, last year's failed policy initiatives of legalizing recreational marijuana and taxing skill games have been offered as "revenue raisers" by the governor.
- These measures did not pass last year and are unlikely to be passed this year, thereby leaving this budget with an even larger spending deficit.
- Overall, this budget proposal offers no new solutions and just pulls from savings. We must live within our means and provide a sensible budget that our Commonwealth can afford.
- More to come as the June 30 deadline approaches.
